The following year, I received a Raoul Wallenberg Scholarship to study as a graduate student at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. To supplement the stipend the fellowship provided, I worked as a house cleaner.

I remained in the Middle East for the next year, teaching English in Cairo, Jerusalem, and Hebron and working at the Israel Palestine Center For Research And Information (IPCRI), a joint Israeli-Palestinian public policy think-tank dedicated to developing practical solutions for the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.
