I was born in Baton Rouge, LA and grew up in Mobile, AL where my father served as a pastor. From an early age, my parents taught me the importance of hard work, treating others fairly and giving back to my community. I have devoted my career to these three important lessons.

I have spent my legal career giving back to the community by working to seek justice and protect victims. Seeking justice is not about winning or losing a trial. Rather, seeking justice is about protecting the rights of the accused as well as the protection of the general public. As an attorney, I worked hard to find creative resolutions to cases that provided some level of satisfaction for all parties. Not all cases were able to be resolved pre-trial. In those cases set for trial, I worked hard to be prepared, efficient and respectful of all participants.

During my career, I have treated opposing counsel, law enforcement and litigants (whether criminal defendants or parents in a dependency case) with dignity, fairness and respect. This is an asset that has served me well in my current position and will continue to serve me well

as a District Court Judge. As a Magistrate, I have worked to make sure that all persons in the courtroom understand the nature of the proceeding, that they will be given an opportunity to be heard and what will happen next. Whether someone is in the courtroom for the first time or whether they are in a situation where emotions are high, knowing what is happening at the outset of the hearing allows them to better participate and understand. They may not like what is happening or the outcome of the hearing, but my goal is that they will walk away feeling like they were heard and were treated fairly.

I believe my years in criminal prosecution and my time as a Magistrate Judge make me uniquely qualified for the position of Palmer District Court Judge. District Court is a very busy court and requires someone who is efficient, organized and calm under stress. I am used to working in stressful conditions with large caseloads and multiple competing deadlines while also remaining respectful to staff and those appearing before the Court.

It would be my honor, and a tremendous responsibility, to continue my public service as a District Court Judge in Palmer.
