Additional Non-Confidential Comments Counsel Questionnaires for Trials & Cases Involving Significant Work

 This portion of the application requested the three most recent cases that have gone to trial and that have involved significant work, and are now fully closed in both trial and appellate courts. For the prosecution, however, significant trial or litigation work leading to convictions often means that closed cases will not be recent cases, and recent cases will not be closed cases.

I spoke with Ms. DiPietro, who told me the Judicial Council would accept cases with pending appeals if necessary to ensure a full and *recent* accounting of trials and significant work if the circumstances indicate that opposing counsel and the judge would be able to give a full and fair accounting of my performance in those cases. One example she gave was if all briefing is completed and the case is awaiting decision in the appellate court.

- State of Alaska v. Samuel Nicketa, 3DI-14-00512CR, was a trial that led to a conviction in 2018, which is currently being appealed. However, if the case is remanded for retrial or resentencing I will not be the assigned attorney because I no longer work for the Department of Law. I believe that Mr. Lesch and Judge Reigh would be able to give an accounting of my performance. Additionally, this case involved significant litigation on a variety of topics, and omitting it would require the Council to reach back over five years for another case that is fully closed in both trial court and the Court of Appeals.¹
- State of Alaska v. Nick Nicoli, 3DI-13-00028CI, is a post-conviction relief case in which I did significant work between 2017 and 2019. It has an appeal pending, No. A-13373. However, according to the Court of Appeals Case Management System briefing is complete and the matter is awaiting conference, with a decision likely to be issued in advance of the Judicial Council's meeting in late January. Furthermore, I will have no further involvement in the case if the trial court's denying the application for post-conviction relief is reversed.

The range of experience I have accumulated in eight and a half years puts me in a good position to succeed as a Superior Court judge in Ketchikan. I have worked in private practice and at every level of government -- municipal, state, and federal -and I have served Alaskans in every corner of the state. I have tried 16 cases before juries and briefed multiple appeals, including two that led to published opinions. I also represented the District Attorney's Office in Bethel and Fairbanks on therapeutic and wellness courts, and in both places I significantly expanded participation and enrollment in those courts. I wrote a law review article that led a state senator to propose a bill to protect the rights of sexual assault victims. And I have spent the last two years working to increase the federal government's efforts to address child exploitation, domestic violence, and sexual abuse in rural Alaska.

My experience as a prosecutor will serve me particularly well in this role. I have extensive experience with felonies, trials, and post-conviction relief litigation, which form the bulk of a Superior Court judge's non-probate work. This is valuable in more ways than one. I have litigated a wide range of legal issues during my career, including topics like the due process implications of delays at API and the right of post-conviction relief applicants to DNA testing. I have also encountered and solved many of the administrative and logistical problems that come up trying to do trials and hearings in places without roads. And perhaps most importantly, I am well-prepared to manage a significant caseload: in Dillingham, for example, I was responsible for over 70 active felony cases and over 200 active misdemeanor cases, and I was able to keep up with discovery and pretrial litigation deadlines in all of these cases.


Additional Comments (Continued)

Superior Court judges are responsible for civil matters as well, and while civil litigation has been a relatively small part of my career I have been able to develop a base of knowledge for working on those cases. My primary responsibilities as an associate in an insurance defense firm include researching and writing pre-litigation liability analyses, sending and responding to discovery requests and handling corresponding litigation, and writing motions for dismissal or summary judgment. The cases I assisted with included matters as varied as medical malpractice, motor vehicle accidents, personal injury, securities fraud, equal employment opportunity, sexual harassment, professional negligence, construction, municipal liability, sovereign immunity, and negligent hiring.

Finally, my experience in rural Alaska will serve me well in Ketchikan. The region covered by the Ketchikan Superior Court includes many small towns, and it is home to a robust and diverse community that includes Alaska's only reservation and numerous Native communities. For most of my career I have lived or worked primarily in remote areas with substantial Indigenous populations. I am dedicated to ensuring that these communities are seen and heard by the criminal justice system, and my experience leaves me well suited to do this successfully.
