As a litigator, most extensively as a scutor, I had a reputation as a thorough, fair and reasonable prosecutor, tough but not hell-bent on retribution. I take enally also my responsibility to ensure that victims receive their rights and their recourse through the system, and believe my standing with my colleagues at the Office of Victim Rights would so reflect. My trial experience though is not confined minal law. At the outset of my legal career, I worked in civil litigation in Chicago, in a range of matters, from complex class as to contracts, estates, family law, and personal injury cases. In federal court, I handled litigation on violations of the matic stay in bankruptcy and Section 1983 cases. After moving to prosecuting criminal cases though, I carried on some matters by representing the government in civil forfeitures derivative of criminal conduct.
