of the court system, judges play a crucial role in maintaining the trust of the community and the legitimacy of our system of justice.

In Kenai, the Alaska Court System has partnered with the Kenaitze Tribal Court to form the Henu' Community Wellness Court, providing desperately needed resources for those struggling with substance abuse issues. New resources are also coming on-line with the Kenai Peninsula Reentry Coalition. The Coalition provides a constellation of resources for individuals released from prison. I strongly support the wellness court and reentry coalition. I am also working with the Tribal Court to establish a restorative justice program on the peninsula. These programs benefit offenders, but also result in reduced recidivism which benefits the entire community.

As a Magistrate Judge, Registrar, and Master for the Superior Court, I handle criminal and civil cases. The civil cases include divorce, dissolution, domestic violence, guardianship, probate, mental health, name changes, FED actions, small claims, and others. I handle large caseloads with short deadlines in a respectful and professional manner. I appreciate the importance of teamwork in the context of a heavy caseload. I am happy to travel to cover other locations as needed.

I work hard every day to ensure that I treat all litigants fairly, with respect, and giving each an opportunity to be heard. I have enjoyed serving as Magistrate Judge, and would be honored to bring both my legal experience and my life experience to the bench as a Superior Court Judge.
