I believe that my legal education and experiences, as well as the other information provided in this application, qualify me to be the District Court judge in Bethel.

I have been aware of Bethel court vacancies and I have been thinking about applying for a Bethel judgeship for some time since I returned to Alaska but have not because I believed I would not be able to meet the residency requirement as my years of practicing law in Alaska have been divided in the middle by the absence to Ireland. I would have applied sooner if I thought there was any way to aggregate my times. Even now I will be close with the residency requirement.

Although I left Alaska for several years I maintained very strong ties and so my connection with Alaska and Bethel is greater than the sum of times I have spent there. I met my wife in Bethel. She was working for the Yukon Kuskokwim Health Corporation as director of their emergency youth shelter at the time. Our first child was born in Bethel and so we both have very strong ties to the community and

we are both fully committed to the Bethel community.

As an assistant public defender I must zealously advocate for my clients in an oftentimes adversarial environment - I believe I have done that to the best of my ability, even though sometimes that means working at cross purposes with the judge or the district attorney. I know as a judge my role would be different in that I would no longer be an advocate but a judge. I do not think I will miss being an advocate. Rather I believe I will relish the opportunity to work for justice by working for all sides, to be fair, and to uphold the integrity and independence of the position. I think my personal traits make it easy for me to observe more and speak less. Thus I believe I could carry out my duties fairly, impartially, and with restraint.

My time as an assistant public defender in Bethel will serve me well as I was responsible for a number of the village calendars at different times. This afforded me opportunities to travel to these bush communities and do trials in a number of them. Now some of my fondest memories are from doing misdemeanor trials in Bethel and the surrounding communities in less than ideal conditions.

I believe my time as a deputy magistrate will allow me to hit the ground running in Bethel. I held weekend arraignments with in custody individuals who were often not at their best and learned to do so with a sense of fairness and respect for all.
