I have lived and worked in Bristol Bay, Alaska for twelve years. I spent close to ten years with Alaska Legal Services in Dillingham and traveled to nearly every village in the Bristol Bay region providing legal aid to individuals and tribes. My experience in the villages and working with residents of Bristol Bay has provided me with the background to make informed decisions tailored to the unique circumstances of Bristol Bay communities.

Dillingham, like many rural communities, has limited access to resources and the programs available on the road system. My time here has helped me understand the challenges rural communities face and has guided me in finding ways to overcome those challenges. For example, when I took the bench, I started a "quasi" therapeutic court with youth who were charged three or more times with minor consuming alcohol. Although Dillingham did not have the funding for a therapeutic court, it did have people committed to helping local youth. The informal program, which lasted 18 months, proved to be successful and many youth who were racking up

charges were able to remain sober and avoid further charges. I believe that my experience in Dillingham makes me particularly well-suited to identify ways to run an efficient and effective court in rural Alaska.

Prior to taking the bench, I served as a court-appointed mediator in custody, CINA and guardianship matters. My training and experience as a mediator easily translated into serving as a settlement judge in custody cases. I have served as a settlement judge in several divorce and custody cases in Dillingham, Kodiak and Unalaska, which has proven to help families resolve disputes in lieu of a costly and contentious trial.

I graduated from Saint Mary's College in 1996 and immediately started a career committed to public service. I worked for non-profits for four years before attending Seattle University School of Law. I graduated in 2003, and moved to Anchorage to clerk for Judge Reese. In 2004, I moved to Dillingham to work for Alaska Legal Services Corporation. I spent ten wonderful years with ALSA representing individuals and tribes throughout the Bristol Bay region. I visited nearly every village in Bristol Bay while carrying a caseload that included tribal court development, ICWA, family law, public benefits, fishing disputes and probate matters. I also served as a court-appointed mediator. In 2014, I transitioned to the court system as Dillingham's Magistrate.

I am fortunate to have landed in Dillingham twelve years ago. My husband is now a commercial fisherman and we are raising our three children in a beautiful and culturally rich community.



## **Supplement to Tina Reigh's Application for Judicial Appointment**

**Question (3) :** My time listed as practicing law includes my Superior Court clerkship which began in September 2003, although I was not licensed until March 2004. I chose not to become licensed in 2003 immediately after I passed the bar because it was not necessary for my work as a law clerk.

**Question 20(c):** I included counsel information from *ITMO S.S.* , which did not go to trial, but did involve a contested evidentiary hearing. Most of the bench trials I preside over do not involve attorneys, so I am providing counsel information from a contested evidentiary hearing in case the Judicial Council wants to solicit counsel questionnaires from counsel in that case. The other cases involved one *pro se* litigant and one attorney, including *McNease v. Boyd*, which was a stalking protective order case; and *City of Dillingham v. Bingman*, which was a forcible entry and detainer case.

**Question 20(d):** I included a case, *Active v. State*, that I worked on for several years prior to taking the bench in 2014 because it is an example of a case in which I did a significant amount of work. I have not had an opportunity to work on a similarly complicated case since becoming a magistrate in 2014.

**Section (21) Writing Sample:** I have submitted a writing sample that I created in mid-June 2011 while I was in practice. The sample was written just over five years ago. My most recent work that would meet the application criteria are all Master's Reports in confidential matters—guardianships and children's proceedings. Because the writing sample is public, I do not feel that it would be appropriate for me to share the Master's Reports. I am servicing a relatively small community and believe that even if I redacted the reports, the identity of the people involved would be easily ascertained. Prior to taking the bench, I was a supervising attorney and collaborated with other attorneys on quite a few briefs. The writing sample provided with this application is a document created solely by me and is representative of my writing skills and legal analysis.
