Bethany Harbison - Profile

Judge Harbison was appointed to the Alaska Court of Appeals in November of 2018. Judge Harbison is one of four judges on the Alaska Court of Appeals, an appellate court for criminal appeals. This is her first retention evaluation as a Court of Appeals judge.

Performance Summary

After conducting its performance review, the Judicial Council determined that Judge Harbison met or exceeded <u>performance standards</u> on all criteria, including legal ability, integrity, impartiality/fairness, temperament, diligence, and administrative skills.

The Council also determined that Judge Harbison met or exceeded educational requirements set by the Alaska Supreme Court, complied with judicial ethics requirements, and made significant contributions to her community and to the administration of justice.

Because Judge Harbison met or exceeded all performance and professional development standards, the Alaska Judicial Council **recommends a "yes" vote** on retention in office.

Performance Findings

The Council conducts a <u>thorough performance review</u> of each judge standing for retention. Key findings for Judge Harbison include:

- Ratings by justice system professionals: Attorneys who appeared before Judge Harbison gave her excellent reviews, as did court employees. The chart shows the survey ratings received by Judge Harbison.
- Professional activities: The Council's review of Judge Harbison's professional activities showed significant contributions to the administration of justice and her community. During her term, Judge Harbison served as a member of the Criminal Rules Committee, the Statewide Court Security and Emergency Preparedness Committee, the Fairness, Diversity, and Equality Committee, the Anti-Sexual Harassment Working Group, and the Magistrate Judge Conference Planning Committee. She represented the Court of Appeals at judicial installations and swearing-in ceremonies, and made a presentation on surviving Alaska hazards for new law clerks. She sponsored her law clerks' participation in the Literacy Council Spelling Bee, participated in a National Association of Women Judges reception in honor of the Court of Appeals, gave a radio interview about the Court of Appeals, and appeared as a guest speaker in a fourth grade class via Zoom to answer questions about the judicial system.
- Other performance indicators: The Council reviewed other performance indicators, including Judge Harbison's financial disclosure and conflict of interest statements, and background checks. Judge Harbison performed well in these areas.
- **Timeliness:** Alaska law requires judges' pay be withheld if a decision is pending longer than six months. The Council verified that Judge Harbison was paid on schedule, and she certified that she had no untimely decisions.
- **Ethics:** There were no public disciplinary proceedings against Judge Harbison, and the Council's review found no ethical concerns.

I was appointed to the Court of Appeals in November 2018, and I began serving in January 2019. Because I had previously served as a trial court judge, I was already familiar with the policies and procedures of the court system. I nevertheless found that the learning curve was steep and that I had much to learn about working on an appellate court. I feel that I have made a successful transition to my new position by working hard and being fully committed to maintaining the analytical rigor that has been the hallmark of this court for decades.

The Court of Appeals is burdened by a busy caseload, including a substantial backlog of cases. As a result, one challenge in my work is to balance the need to issue a decision promptly, in order to reduce the number of cases awaiting decision, with the need to issue clear opinions that are based on a thorough review of the record and the relevant legal principles. Another challenge is learning to work both efficiently and collaboratively. It is difficult to find time to prepare and circulate my own draft opinions and also to provide prompt feedback to the other judges on their circulating drafts.

As I have grown more comfortable in my role as an appellate judge, I truly enjoy the work. I particularly enjoy the exchange of views with my colleagues and the opportunities I have to learn from them and from the lawyers who appear before us. But even the days I spend alone reading and writing go by quickly because our cases are very interesting and demand my full attention.

I believe that my experience working as a trial court judge brings an important perspective to a court where the other judges do not have a similarly extensive background conducting trials. And because I spent several years serving as a presiding judge, I have administrative skills that have been useful to the court.

I work hard every day to improve my performance, and I am committed to continuing to better myself as an appellate judge. I am honored to have been given this opportunity and hope to continue to serve the people of Alaska in this position.
