The Alaska Judicial Council evaluates judges on a number of criteria, including legal ability, demeanor, diligence, ability to manage their caseloads, and fairness and integrity. The Judicial Council finds Judge Stowers to be **Qualified** and recommends unanimously that the public vote **"YES"** to retain him as a superior court judge.

Alaska Judicial Council Recommendation Judge Craig F. Stowers, Superior Court, Anchorage

Judicial Council Recommendation

The Alaska Judicial Council, a non-partisan citizens commission established by the Alaska constitution, evaluates judges on criteria that include legal ability, demeanor, diligence, ability to manage their caseloads, and fairness and integrity. The Judicial Council finds Judge Stowers to be *Qualified* and recommends unanimously that the public vote "YES" to retain him as a superior court judge.

Judicial Council Evaluation

The Judicial Council surveyed 2,884 attorneys and 1,539 peace and probation officers, together with social workers/guardians ad litem, and child advocates, jurors, and court employees about the judges on the ballot. Respondents were asked to rate judicial performance and to submit comments. The Council also reviewed the ratings and observations of the Alaska Judicial Observers, independent community-based volunteers. The Council reviewed court system records concerning peremptory challenges, recusals, and appellate affirmance and reversal rates; any civil or criminal litigation involving the judge; APOC and court system conflict-of-interest statements; any public disciplinary files; and whether a judge's pay was withheld for an untimely decision. The Council investigated judicial conduct in specific cases. The Council interviewed some judges, attorneys, court staff, and others, and held a statewide public hearing to obtain comments about judges.

Summary of Survey Information

Attorneys in Alaska rated Judge Stowers on the six categories summarized in the table above, using 5 as the highest rating possible. The attorney rating for Judge Stowers on overall performance was 4.4. Peace and probation officers rated Judge Stowers on five categories, using the 5-point scale above. They gave Judge Stowers a rating of 4.1.

Four other groups also evaluated Judge Stowers' performance, using the same 5-point scale with 5 as the highest rating. Jurors rated him 5.0 overall, court employees gave him 4.2, and social workers, guardians ad litem and CASA volunteers rated him at 3.9. The Alaska Judicial Observers rated him 3.55.

Recommendation: Vote "YES" to retain Judge Craig F. Stowers

I am very happy in every aspect of my work, and I am committed to being the very best judge I can possibly be, and to providing the very best service I can to the public, the attorneys and litigants who come before me, and to the Court System.

Though my assigned area of responsibility is civil, I have obtained some experience in criminal law matters by virtue of my responsibility to cover the Kodiak Superior Court when Judge Bolger is preempted or disqualifies himself from cases. I dedicate 1 week every other month for Kodiak matters, and I also calendar Kodiak matters on my regular calendar whenever the need arises.

I have a deep interest in continuing judicial and legal education, both personally, and institutionally. I have read and studied voraciously regarding my own personal development as a judge, and I serve on the Supreme Court's Judicial Education Committee (and have facilitated and presented several substantive judicial training sessions). I have also conducted training or presentations at several Alaska Bar CLE functions, and for Court System staff.

Two areas of special focus for me have been to actively foster high standards of professionalism and courtesy in the courtroom, and to develop expertise and make myself available for judicial settlement conferences (including CINA cases) in my own cases and for other judges.

Evaluation of Judge Craig F. Stowers: Alaska Bar Association Members

Summary of Findings

Judge Craig F. Stowers was evaluated by 219 Alaska Bar Association members who reported having direct professional experience with the judge. The mean score on *overall evaluation* was 4.4. Evaluation of Judge Craig F. Stowers: Peace and Probation Officers

Summary of Findings

Judge Craig F. Stowers was evaluated by 15 Peace and Probation Officers who reported having direct professional experience with the judge. The mean score on *overall* evaluation was 4.1. The highest mean scores were obtained on *integrity* and *judicial* temperament (4.1) and the lowest mean score was obtained on *impartiality/fairness* (3.9). 
Summary of Findings

Judge Craig F. Stowers was evaluated by 19 Social Workers, Guardians ad Litem, and CASA Volunteers who reported having direct professional experience with the judge. The mean score on *overall evaluation* was 3.9. The highest mean scores were obtained on *integrity* and *diligence* (4.3) and the lowest mean score was obtained on *impartiality/fairness* (3.8). Details are presented in the two tables that follow.

Salary Warrant Withholdings - Judge Stowers

Judge Stowers had his pay withheld by the Department of Administration nineteen times in three years (2005-2007) for failing to submit an affidavit stating that he had no matter uncompleted or undecided for longer than six months per AS 22.10.190. Eleven of these instances occurred in 2006. Three occurred in 2007.

The Judicial Council asked Judge Stowers about the circumstances that required his pay to be withheld. Judge Stowers advised that when he was appointed to the bench in 2004, he inherited a caseload that was substantially larger than average for Anchorage Superior Court civil judges. He experienced unexpected turnover with his support staff. The judge stated that he worked hard to master subjects of law that were new to him. Judge Stowers explained that for one-third of the nineteen times that his pay was withheld, he did not have any uncompleted matters pending for longer than six months. On those occasions, the judge simply did not submit a timely affidavit to that effect. The Council noted improvement in the timeliness of Judge Stowers' decisions since 2005.
