Judicial Council Recommendation 2010

The Alaska Judicial Council is a non-partisan citizens' commission established by the Alaska constitution. Alaskan law requires the Council to evaluate judges' performance and authorizes the Council to recommend to voters whether judges should be retained in office. The Judicial Council reviews judges' integrity, diligence, legal ability, fairness, demeanor, ability to manage their caseloads, and overall performance of their judicial responsibilities in and out of the courtroom. The Judicial Council finds Judge Kauvar to be *Qualified* and recommends unanimously that the public vote "YES" to retain her as a district court judge.

Judicial Council Evaluation

The Judicial Council surveyed thousands of Alaskans including peace and probation officers, court employees, attorneys, jurors, social workers/guardians ad litem, and child advocates about the judges on the ballot. Respondents were asked to rate judicial performance and to submit comments. The Council also reviewed the ratings and observations of the Alaska Judicial Observers, independent community-based volunteers. The Council reviewed the judge's peremptory challenge, recusals, and appellate affirmance and reversal rates; any civil or criminal litigation involving the judge; APOC and court system conflict-of-interest statements; any disciplinary files involving the judge; and whether a judge's pay was withheld for an untimely decision. The Council reviewed other court records and investigated judicial conduct in specific cases. The Council interviewed some judges, attorneys, and court staff, and held a statewide public hearing to obtain comments about judges.

Summary of Survey Information

Survey respondents rated Judge Kauvar on the categories summarized in the table above, using 5 as the highest rating possible. The attorney rating for Judge Kauvar on overall performance was 3.8. Peace and probation officers gave Judge Kauvar a rating of 2.8. Jurors rated her 4.8 overall, court employees gave her 4.3, and social workers, guardians ad litem and CASA volunteers rated her at 5.0.

Although I have been a judge for many years, I continue to find the work interesting, challenging, and rewarding. In light of all the new appointees to the Fairbanks court, I believe that my years of experience on the bench are put to good use. My involvement in the Fairbanks community since 1973 also contributes to giving me a broad perspective. During this last term, I have continued to fill in for Superior Court whenever needed, both in Fairbanks and Bethel.

For many years, I have handled settlement conferences, and my broad experience and knowledge has contributed to helping people reach a satisfactory resolution. In June, 2009, I was very fortunate to be able to use my access to additional judicial training to attend a week long course at the National Judicial College in Civil Mediation. During this intense week, I gained valuable skills and I became certified as a mediator. I have used the new skills and approaches that I learned, during settlement conferences since my return, and I am able to directly see how beneficial the course was. It is very satisfying to be able to continue to grow as a judge, and I have encouraged others to attend the course.

This year I also became a training judge for magistrates in the Bethel area, and have helped in the Fairbanks area as well. While I have always been available for the magistrates if they have questions, I now enjoy the new responsibilities that have come with this position. This summer and fall, I made my first trips to Aniak, Chevak, and Emmonak, which were all interesting and rewarding. We have wonderful hard-working people working as magistrates, without being lawyers, and assisting them has added a new dimension to my work.

I am willing to contribute new ideas and try new procedures. My clerk and I have become a model for the new "No Dark Courtroom Project", and judges and clerks from Palmer and Anchorage have come to court to learn from us. The project is designed to get the judgments signed and distributed while the parties are still in the courtroom, and the information is entered right then into the computer. This increases efficiency for the court, and benefits the parties.

At the same time, I continue to serve as a Deputy Presiding Judge for the District Court, and meet regularly with the Presiding Judge, Area Court Administrator, and the Clerk of Court. I serve on hiring committees for numerous positions, which recently has included a number of magistrates and masters. I also carry a full District Court case load, and volunteer to work week-ends, to allow magistrates with young children to have additional time with them. While I no longer have children living at home, I still remember when I did, and strive to accommodate attorneys, court staff, and other judicial officers who still have children at home.

The Council also considers survey ratings by jurors and court employees, public comments, and the ratings by the independent citizen volunteers at Alaska Judicial Observers. Along with the personal observations of the hundreds of people who had direct professional experience with the judge, the Council reviews any litigation involving the judge, conflict of interest records, public disciplinary files, and indicators of judicial performance such as appellate affirmances and reversals, and peremptory challenges and recusals.
