Judicial Council Recommendation 2010

The Alaska Judicial Council is a non-partisan citizens' commission established by the Alaska constitution. Alaskan law requires the Council to evaluate judges' performance and authorizes the Council to recommend to voters whether judges should be retained in office. The Judicial Council reviews judges' integrity, diligence, legal ability, fairness, demeanor, ability to manage their caseloads, and overall performance of their judicial responsibilities in and out of the courtroom. Judge McKay was reprimanded by the Alaska Supreme Court as a result of the judge's conviction for Driving Under the Influence. Judge McKay responded honestly and constructively to this reprimand and complied with the court's treatment requirements and other conditions in every respect. The Judicial Council finds Judge McKay to be **Qualified** and recommends unanimously that the public vote "YES" to retain him as a superior court judge.

Judicial Council Evaluation

The Judicial Council surveyed thousands of Alaskans including peace and probation officers, court employees, attorneys, jurors, social workers/guardians ad litem, and child advocates about the judges on the ballot. Respondents were asked to rate judicial performance and to submit comments. The Council also reviewed the ratings and observations of the Alaska Judicial Observers, independent community-based volunteers. The Council reviewed the judge's peremptory challenge, recusals, and appellate affirmance and reversal rates; any civil or criminal litigation involving the judge; APOC and court system conflict-of-interest statements; any disciplinary files involving the judge; and whether a judge's pay was withheld for an untimely decision. The Council reviewed other court records and investigated judicial conduct in specific cases. The Council interviewed some judges, attorneys, and court staff, and held a statewide public hearing to obtain comments about judges.

Summary of Survey Information

Survey respondents rated Judge McKay on the categories summarized in the table above, using 5 as the highest rating possible. The attorney rating for Judge McKay on overall performance was 4.1. Peace and probation officers gave Judge McKay a rating of 3.3. Jurors rated him 5.0 overall, court employees gave him 4.6, and social workers, guardians ad litem and CASA volunteers rated him at 3.5. The Alaska Judicial Observers rated him 3.57.

Additionally, I have performed other duties as requested including student tours, bench/bar meetings and the like.

After my appointment, I was first assigned to the civil calendar and I recall the surprise at the number of pro per parties, especially in domestic cases. I was fortunate to conduct an unusual number of jury trial days as a civil judge which served well when I was asked to serve on the criminal bench. After a steep, but quick, learning curve, I believe I was able to respond well to the task. During my tenure on the criminal bench, the felony case load grew exponentially, but as a team, I am proud that we were able to maximize our resources and meet the serious challenges to the entire system, from support staff to jury clerks, judicial services, in-courts and administrative assistants.

Back in civil, after an almost three year stint on the criminal bench, I can see the burgeoning effects of the continued increase in pro per involvement in the court system. I see the need for more education of these external customers. I'd like to be part of that process.

My most passionate interest since appointment has been to express, by word and actions, the value that citizens who have contact with the court system provide to the justice system. I love working with jurors and respect their time and commitment.

I continue to enjoy the daily challenges of a fast-pace, yet detail oriented, profession. I believe it is important to remember that even small disputes may be the most important issue a litigant has to currently deal with in their life.

I believe I perform this job well and would be honored to continue.

The Judicial Council's Evaluation Process

State law requires the Judicial Council to evaluate each judge standing for retention, and to report its evaluations to the voters. The three surveys reported here are an important part of the Council's evaluations. The Council also considers survey ratings by jurors and court employees, public comments, and the ratings by the independent citizen volunteers at Alaska Judicial Observers. Along with the personal observations of the hundreds of people who had direct professional experience with the judge, the Council reviews any litigation involving the judge, conflict of interest records, public disciplinary files, and indicators of judicial performance such as appellate affirmances and reversals, and peremptory challenges and recusals.
