Alaska Judicial Council Recommendation Judge Anna M. Moran, Superior Court, Kenai

Judicial Council Recommendation 2010

The Alaska Judicial Council is a non-partisan citizens' commission established by the Alaska constitution. Alaskan law requires the Council to evaluate judges' performance and authorizes the Council to recommend to voters whether judges should be retained in office. The Judicial Council reviews judges' integrity, diligence, legal ability, fairness, demeanor, ability to manage their caseloads, and overall performance of their judicial responsibilities in and out of the courtroom. The Judicial Council finds Judge Moran to be *Qualified* and recommends unanimously that the public vote "YES" to retain her as a superior court judge.

Judicial Council Evaluation

The Judicial Council surveyed thousands of Alaskans including peace and probation officers, court employees, attorneys, jurors, social workers/guardians ad litem, and child advocates about the judges on the ballot. Respondents were asked to rate judicial performance and to submit comments. The Council also reviewed the ratings and observations of the Alaska Judicial Observers, independent community-based volunteers. The Council reviewed the judge's peremptory challenge, recusals, and appellate affirmance and reversal rates; any civil or criminal litigation involving the judge; APOC and court system conflict-of-interest statements; any disciplinary files involving the judge; and whether a judge's pay was withheld for an untimely decision. The Council reviewed other court records and investigated judicial conduct in specific cases. The Council interviewed some judges, attorneys, and court staff, and held a statewide public hearing to obtain comments about judges.

Summary of Survey Information

Survey respondents rated Judge Moran on the categories summarized in the table above, using 5 as the highest rating possible. The attorney rating for Judge Moran on overall performance was 3.9. Peace and probation officers gave Judge Moran a rating of 3.2. Jurors rated her 4.9 overall, court employees gave her 4.4, and social workers, guardians ad litem and CASA volunteers rated her at 4.8.

Before my appointment, I was a member of the Children's Rules Committee and I was a Magistrate Training Judge. After my appointment in 2007, Justice Fabe asked if I would step down from these responsibilities to attend to the affairs of the Kenai court, especially given the retirement of Judge Brown, the deployment of Judge Huguelet to Iraq, and the impending Kenai courthouse remodel project. Since that time, I have not been asked to join any state committees. However, I have been active on the local level and have participated and attended several Bench/Bar meetings with civil attorneys, criminal attorneys, and those who routinely handle children's cases. I have also been actively involved with the local attorneys and

the Clerk of Court in redesigning our criminal court calendar.

3. Please assess, in one or two paragraphs, your judicial performance during your present term. Appropriate areas of comment could include: satisfaction with your judicial role, specific contributions to the judiciary or the field of law, increases in legal knowledge and judicial skills, or other measures of judicial abilities that you believe to be important.

My first year was indeed a challenge. Within just a few months of my appointment, Judge Brown retired, Judge Huguelet was deployed to Iraq and the Kenai courthouse began a major remodel requiring the creation of a new calendar.

I was fortunate to have the support of a wonderful clerk's office, a good judicial assistant and law clerk, as well as help from judges in Anchorage and elsewhere who covered the Seward and Homer calendars. We weathered many storms. Like all storms, the skies eventually cleared: Judge Bauman was appointed to the bench, Judge Huguelet returned from Iraq, safe and sound, and the court house remodel was finished.

I have always loved my job, first as a Magistrate/Master and now as a Superior Court Judge. I especially enjoy the wide range of cases and unique and complex questions of law that come before me on a regular basis.

My goal as a judge is to be compassionate and fair to all parties, and to recognize each person's individuality. This means being a good listener, treating everyone equally, and ensuring each citizen has had the opportunity to be heard. I try to apply these concepts whether I am sentencing a defendant in a criminal case, making a custody determination in a family law case, or deciding complex property rights in a civil matter. It continues to be a pleasure to serve the State of Alaska in this capacity.

The Council also considers survey ratings by jurors and court employees, public comments, and the ratings by the independent citizen volunteers at Alaska Judicial Observers. Along with the personal observations of the hundreds of people who had direct professional experience with the judge, the Council reviews any litigation involving the judge, conflict of interest records, public disciplinary files, and indicators of judicial performance such as appellate affirmances and reversals, and peremptory challenges and recusals.
