Although my parents were educated, I never expected to graduate from college or to become a lawyer. I dropped out of high school, the first time when I was 14 years old, the last time at age 16. I did a lot of hard physical work and wanted to become a soldier and, eventually, a farmer. Neither of those worked out. Since then, I have lived a lot of life in overseas environments where I was the person who was the "foreigner." In Alaska, I was frequently working with native people in forest fire fighting and construction jobs. It must have been odd when native people saw us white people coming into the country and acting like it all belonged to us whites. I would work well in a Native community and I also have a lot of sympathy and empathy for the folks who are trying to make it on laborer's or waitress' wages. My lawyer work, whether criminal or civil, was almost entirely a matter of representing ordinary people, most of whom were in difficult financial situations. I have reached a stage where other lawyers ask me for advice and ask me to be an arbitrator in their cases. My hobby, if I have one, is watching trials or doing trials. A judgeship would put me in the front row seat for such a hobby.

Additional Comments (Continued)

When I was younger, I did mineral exploration out of Bethel and fire fighting on the Seward Peninsula. I loved those places and a chance to have a judgeship out there would be wonderful. My wife, Barbara, was born and raised in Palmer on a small farm. She would also enjoy living out in the bush. We have been married 37 years and have a 22 year old daughter who is studying biology at Tulane University in New Orleans.

Barb and I lived in Fairbanks for 11 years and enjoyed it. A judgeship in Fairbanks would not require us to get acclimated.

I have had a wide range of cases as an attorney. Divorce, child custody, Child in Need of Aid, Workers' Comp, Personal Injury, Maritime, Insurance disputes, and Misdemeanor and Felony Criminal Cases.

I try to be the person who keeps the peace. A couple of lifetimes ago, I had the job of listening to tapes of pilots who had been shot down over Laos so we could try to locate their remains. These men knew they were going to die. Although there was only one pilot who survived being shot down in the entire Laotian war, none of the tapes had anyone yelling or screaming or blaming anyone. I think of that sometimes when I hear a lawyer screaming at a secretary over a typo. People need to stay calm and keep some perspective. I hope to carry that attitude into a judge's job.
