During my years at the Anchorage District Attorney's Office, I appeared regularly in court and handled a large volume of cases, first in the misdemeanor unit, and subsequently in the felony drug and felony violent crimes units. I prepared, negotiated, and tried numerous cases, and in doing so, established good working relationships with both my fellow A.D.A.'s and my opposing counsel. I also enjoyed working regularly with the public, both in communicating with witnesses and victims of crime, and in addressing citizens serving as jurors and grand jurors. Finally, I served as supervisor of the Anchorage D.A.'s Office misdemeanor unit for several months, and therein gained experience mentoring, organizing, and leading a group of young attorneys and staff.

During my years of civil practice, I have handled a variety of cases involving many different legal issues. Those issues have run the gamut from personal injury claims to complex maritime matters to questions of copyright and foreclosure law. I am a strong researcher, writer, and litigator, and have a good working knowledge of many aspects of civil law. Civil practice has allowed me to work regularly with clients, witnesses, opposing counsel, and judges throughout the State of Alaska. My experience in private practice has included both trial and appellate work, in addition to handling of administrative hearings and appeals.
