Development Center. I also coordinated city and village development projects including
a waste oil and hazardous material recovery system and construction of public
recreation area projects (docks and trails).

During my tenure, I supervised employees and contracted staff. I reported to a multi-member board of directors from Chenega Bay, Cordova, Tatitlek, Valdez, and Whittier, and Chenega and Eyak Village Corporations. I was responsible for legal compliance with state agency project grants, contract oversight, corporate budget preparation and review. The annual operating and project budget was over \$1.5 million at the time of my resignation to attend law school.

Two grievances have been filed against me, but neither was accepted by bar counsel for investigation. In 2008, a defendant who had been convicted of first-degree sexual abuse of a minor for sexually abusing his daughter filed a grievance against the trial judge (Judge Jeffrey), his attorney (Bob Lewis), and me, claiming that since he was a "dangerous man" the judge should have had the police pick him up at court sooner than they did. In 2006, a defendant who had been convicted of several misdemeanors (related to being intoxicated and breaking the windshield of his mother's car when she

refused to give him more money) accepted a plea agreement but later in jail decided it was not a good deal and filed a grievance against me.

Additional Comments (Non-Confidential)

23. Please make any additional comments that you wish to bring to the Council's attention about your experience and suitability for this judgeship.

During my career with the Dept. of Law, I have had the opportunity to try cases in several rural locations -- Cordova, Dillingham, Glennallen, Kotzebue, and Valdez. Rural courts have their own pace and mode which can be quite different than the urban courts (Anchorage and Palmer) where I have practiced. Relationships are always important, but a premium is placed on them in small rural areas. I have learned to place special importance on working with others -- not sweating the little things, but keeping an eye on the big picture.

I have also learned that a judge should appreciate the people that come before the court -- their background and life circumstances -- to get a clearer picture of the individual to promote understanding and improve communication. This dynamic is paramount in Kotzebue and villages like it.

Additional Comments (Continued)

My parents helped form my appreciation of people. They connected with everyday folks — the store cashier, the waitress, the gas attendant. My father was the first generation of his Mexican-American family to be born in the United States. They worked hard and cared for people no matter their background and that example was imprinted on me at an early age. My faith teaches this approach to people. It is imperative that a judge walk in humility and be a careful listener.

For nearly four years I managed the Kotzebue D.A.'s Office. I was told before I transferred there from the Palmer office that Kotzebue was the busiest solo attorney office in the State. Each year I handled an average of 800 to 1000 criminal cases per year. I was also responsible for the juvenile cases. I appeared in court on a daily basis, and often multiple times in a day. I appeared in front of the Barrow, Nome, and Kotzebue Superior Court judges who presided over Kotzebue cases most weeks. I had trials in front of each of these judges and observed their approaches to handling criminal cases, juvenile matters, and court staff.

I traveled throughout the Northwest Arctic Borough region during my time in Kotzebue and have returned to visit since leaving a year ago. I traveled up the Kobuk and Noatak rivers and have used boat, snow-go, and small airplane to visit most of the surrounding villages. My family and I enjoyed the subsistence lifestyle of hunting, fishing, and picking berries.

I grew up in a small Alaska town and enjoyed its size and pace. I have lived in, visited, or had contact with people living in rural areas and villages throughout my adult life in the context of directing a non-profit organization, working for a civil firm, and as a state attorney.

I believe my personal, professional, and legal experiences throughout Alaska have uniquely prepared me to serve as a superior court judge in Kotzebue.
