Feb. of 2001 and April or May of 2011; Kenneth Manning, a pro se opposing litigant, brought complaints against me to the Bar, alleging that my advice to the Bd. of Game was blatantly unconstitutional. He also accused me of suborning perjury. Neither complaint was accepted for investigation by the Bar. The underlying facts as to the first complaint are also addressed in State v. Manning, 161 P.3d 1215, in which the Supreme Court affirmed the trial ct's decision that no sanctions were warranted.

I was briefly sanctioned by Judge Wolverton in an unlawful eviction case in 1990 or '91 when my pro bono (evicted) clients failed to show up for a scheduled deposition and could not be located despite extensive efforts on my part. He ordered me to pay my opponent's costs. That order was subsequently withdrawn as I protested and the case was eventually resolved by a settlement.

### **Additional Comments (Non-Confidential)**

23. Please make any additional comments that you wish to bring to the Council's attention about your experience and suitability for this judgeship.

People need someone to really listen to them and understand their points of view before giving advice or rendering judgment. Likewise, people need someone to finally give a fair judgment once the facts are in and all arguments are made. Friends, coworkers and others have relied on me to do these things all my life, and I hold such trust as sacred. Having been through the judicial selection process several times, I understand that merely wanting to serve is not enough. Alaska needs the best judges we can get, not merely those who meet basic qualifications. Whether I fit that criterion is for the Council and Governor to decide, but my commitment to the Council is that being a judge who cares about people and uses every opportunity to try to make Alaska a better place, one set of litigants at a time, would be my permanent goal, and eagerness coupled with hard work would be my tools for achieving it.

Over the past several selection processes, some have questioned the depth of my experience. While my career has focused more on difficult natural resource issues in recent years, the Department of Law has assigned me to a wide variety of civil cases

over my career, including consumer protection, collections, bankruptcy, taxation, local government, civil rights, employment, campaign finance and other elections issues, professional licensing, torts, contractual disputes and drafting, procurement, disaster management, property law, eminent domain, and many other constitutional issues. I've also routinely assisted criminal prosecutors in briefing some of the more complicated natural resource-related issues in their cases. As one of the more Senior Assistant Attorneys General, I have long served on the office's Settlement and Case Evaluation Committee, which reviews and makes recommendations on strategy for all major cases headed to trial and all proposed settlements meeting certain threshold criteria. This requires me to be familiar with and make judgments about many of the most pressing legal issues facing the Department of Law at any given time. Each meeting of the committee is, in effect, the equivalent of a short CLE course on a particular area of law covered by the Attorney Generals' Office.
