In 2000 I withdrew from a representation of a client in Petersburg because another, current client had testified against him at a grand jury proceedings. Based on the Rules of Professional Conduct 1.2, 1.7 and 1.9 I moved to withdraw from the case. The client notified the AK Bar Association, upset that I could not represent him. I explained the reasons for my withdrawal from the case to the Alaska Bar and the complaint did not go any further.

Additional Comments (Non-Confidential)

23. Please make any additional comments that you wish to bring to the Council's attention about your experience and suitability for this judgeship.

I believe my years as a criminal defense attorney make me uniquely qualified for the position of District Court Judge. I am used to working in stressful conditions with large workloads and short deadlines from my years of representing both private and court appointed clients. District Court is similarly very busy and requires someone who can deal with the stress and get things done efficiently and professionally while being respectful of the people appearing before the court.

I am excited about the recent changes and direction the Juneau court system is headed. Therapeutic court (for drugs and alcohol) and the Mental Health court (CRP) have been key in assisting my clients in getting out of the revolving door of the justice system and become productive members of the local community. Frequently, people appearing in District Court have additional issues in their lives that are difficult to address in the court system. Many people who appear in District Court are chronic alcoholics, drug addicted, mentally ill and homeless. These populations

have additional issues that are difficult for the court to address. I am open to looking at possible new ways to address some of these issues. I am also a big supporter of continuing the therapeutic and CRP courts in Juneau.

When I first came to Alaska and worked at the Juneau Public Defender's Office there was a program in Kake, AK which allowed low level criminal charges to be sent to a tribal court in Kake where the tribe determined how to deal with the offender. My experience in how this system worked was positive and I found it to be very healing for both the victim(s), the perpetrator, the families and the community. Given my limited experience with the alternative justice format in Kake, AK I am very excited to hear that the tribal courts are taking more control and getting more involved in a variety of cases. I hope the expansion of tribal courts continue.

I have lived in Juneau, AK for over seventeen years. My legal work is primarily in Southeast, Alaska. I feel very integrated and a part of the local community. I am lucky enough to live in a neighborhood where the neighbors have all become very close friends and family. I've met people from work and from various social organizations who keep me active and grounded. I cannot imagine a better place to live and work than in Southeast, Alaska.
